

Constantin Ardeleanu

Dr. Constantin Ardeleanu is lecturer at the History Department, “The Lower Danube” University of Galati, Romani, and postdoctoral scholar of the Romanian Academy, “Nicolae Iorga” History Institute, Bucharest, with a research topic related to the economic competition between the Danubian ports and Odessa (first part of the 19th century). He teaches courses in modern Romanian history and his area of interest covers topics such as: maritime and naval history, the role of the Danube and the Black Sea in Romanian and European history. Dr. Ardeleanu is member in the editorial board of the International Journal of Maritime History, member of the International Maritime Economic History Association, included in the Mediterranean Maritime Historians Database, member in other national associations of historians. Dr. Ardeleanu has recently coordinated a research project (The Maritime Danube in the route-ways of European Trade. 1829-1948. Qualitative and quantitative aspects regarding the economic exchanges and the navigation at the Danube Mouths), with the financial support of the Romanian Ministry of Education. His latest published volumes are: *The evolution of British economic and political interests at the Danube mouths (1829-1914)*, Brăila, 2008 and *The foreign trade and the navigation at the Lower Danube. Statistical series (1881-1900)*, Galați, 2008 (both in Romanian).
